

The copper whale which is over 40 feet long with its calf are life-sized and they adorn the wall of the Kalanihookaha Community Center in Nanakuli on the Waianae coast of Oahu. 



# Continuous Support to the Super Typhoon Victims in Guinobatan, Albay, Philippines

They could only salvage the spring semester by quickly enrolling in a nearby government school. But there was tuition to pay and uniforms to purchase. Our Priory provided both tuition and uniforms for the 19 children and their school year was saved.
